

The Home School Community Liaison scheme has been in operation for more than twenty years in Ireland. The National Education Welfare Board is responsible for the scheme. A school which has the scheme has a dedicated Teacher appointed to work as an intermediary between home and school. That teacher in Finn Valley College is currently Angela Ward.

The main aim of the HSCL is to promote partnership between parents and teachers to improve educational opportunities and outcomes for students. It is hoped that by teachers and parents working together, children will be more likely to come to school, be active and participants in school life and remain at school.

Finn Valley College promotes initiatives and activities that encourage parents and guardians to become more involved in their children's education.

INVOLVEMENT?

- 1. The Student Journal is the main daily mode of facilitating communication between parents and teachers. Parents are encouraged to sign the student diary every evening, check for notes from teachers and/or share information with a teacher in the space provided.
- 2. Student Reports are posted home at least twice annually. This comprehensive document shows academic, behavioural and attendance progress.
- 3. Parent Teacher Meetings are generally held shortly after the issuing of a school report. Teachers and parents can plan how best to work together to improve the educational outcomes for the children.
- 4. Other Correspondence may include text messages re upcoming events and phone calls or letters from the Year Head/Guidance Counsellor/SEN Coordinator/HSCL Teacher.
- 5. Parent/Guardian Support the HSCL/SEN Coordinator/Guidance Counsellor is available to discuss issues and difficulties a child may be having in school and can offer direction. Parents and Teachers can work together to devise a short-term/long-term support plan tailored to meet the individual needs of the child.
- 6. Attendance is monitored daily by the Tracking Secretary who may phone home to determine why a child is absent. Poor school attendance will merit input from the HSCL teacher who will work with the parent to find solutions to improve the child's attendance.
- 7. Parent Classes are organised by the HSCL Teacher. The classes are generally free of charge and are open to all parents. Keep an eye on the website for upcoming classes. If a parent has any suggestions for a particular night class please contact <u>angelaward@donegaletb.ie</u>. Classes can take the form of six week courses or workshops over an evening. The school offers well-attended classes on positive parenting, healthy eating and wellbeing.
- 8. Induction Programme for incoming first years begins early in the year. Primary school visits by the Principal and his team ensure all students are equipped with the information they need before deciding on a secondary school. Open Day for students of sixth class takes place in November with open night for parents providing further information that same evening.
- 9. Transition Programme for first years ensures that the school is aware of the needs of the child before they commence school. The SEN Coordinator/HSCL Teacher visits the local primary schools after enrolment to meet with the 6th class teachers/Principal/Teacher of Learning Support/parents and other professionals e.g. NEPS Psychologist where appropriate. This allows a plan to be drawn up before the child commences first year. Special visits to Finn Valley College can be arranged for individual sixth class students where necessary. The Transition Programme for incoming first years normally includes two full days at the school where students become familiar with the school environment, their new peers and the general operation of the school.
- **10.** Information Evenings are provided for parents of new first years and for parents whose children are selecting subjects for their Leaving Certificate. Programme information evenings e.g. JCSP/LCA are also held to ensure parents are informed.


