EDNA O'BRIEN - RENOWNED AUTHOR


- Edna O'Brien is an internationally acclaimed Irish author known for her powerful and evocative writing.

The 1896 discovery of radioactivity by Henri Becquerel inspired Marie and Pierre Curie to further investigate this phenomenon. They examined many substances and minerals for signs of radioactivity. They found that the mineral pitchblende was more radioactive than uranium and concluded that it must contain other radioactive substances. From it they managed to extract two previously unknown elements, polonium and radium, both more radioactive than uranium.

Amber Barrett (born 16 January 1996) is an Irish international footballer who plays for Super League club Standard Liège. She made her debut for the Republic of Ireland women's national football team in September 2017.

When she was young her mother would tell her fairy stories which sparked her interest in storytelling. Despite her disability she later went on to write a variety of stories including Granny's Wonderful Chair which at the time of its release was was a bestseller. Frances went to Edinburgh in 1847 to further her career and eventually moved to London in 1852. Frances Browne is inspiring to all of us as she did not let her disability stop her from living her life to the fullest.
