The Donegal Youth Council Agenda Day (AGM) took place on Wednesday 5th November in the Clanree Hotel, Letterkenny. The AGM has a number of objectives, including discussing and exploring issues or matters of importance to



young people; prioritising five key topics on these matters that will provide the focus of work for the Donegal Youth Council over the following year and providing feedback on the progress made on the topics identified as important at the previous AGM. The event saw 150 young people from all across the county come together for this consultation event, where they had the opportunity to put forward their ideas, participate in facilitated discussions and vote to determine the key issues for young people in the county. These issues were prioritised and now form the basis of the work of the Donegal Youth Council over their two year term from 2014-2016. Issues included mental health, road safety, sexual health, body image, sports, physical health, drink and drugs and bullying. Donegal ETB's Integrating Literacy & Numeracy Policy Launched

Donegal ETB's Adult and Further Education Service launched its Integration of Literacy and Numeracy Policy for the service on 4 December. Integrating literacy is a strategy that combines content with literacy, language and numeracy skills. The purpose of the policy is to enable higher retention rates, a higher proportion of students achieving vocational qualifications, a higher proportion of students achieving language, literacy and numeracy qualifications and ensuring students are better prepared for future job roles. This will be achieved through a cross-programme working group, the promotion of a whole-programme and whole-service approach, clear recruitment and access policies to facilitate entry of students at the correct course level for them, collaboration between programme staff and adult literacy organisers, provision of training for teachers/tutors and the use of plain English.

have been applying the training in their centres during delivery of FETAC Levels 3 and 4 mathematics.



Restorative Practices Work Presented to Harvard Academic

On 12 December, Youthreach County Coordinator, Dr Sandra Buchanan, had the opportunity to present Donegal ETB's restorative practices work to Harvard academic Dr Ofrit Liviatan (Department of Government). Dr Liviatan was visiting Co Donegal to find out more about the peacebuilding work which has been taking place in the county, funded through Peace III. Sandra provided an overview of Donegal ETB's Restorative Practices project which ran from August 2012-October 2013 and March-September 2014 and also showed her the short film made by Lifford Youthreach during this time entitled *Lifford Youthreach Presents a Journey in Restorative Practices*. Both the presentation and film were very well received.

Gortahork's Finn Enters 'Creep' to ICCL 2014 Youthreach Competition

As part of his Personal & Interpersonal Level 4 studies one of our learners, Finn Baldran, entered the Irish Council for Civil Liberties Human Rights Competition 2014.



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He entered this competition because he wished to express himself about social

rights, in particular the right to mental health help. He did this through the creation of a short film which he called 'Creep'. The film depicts the descent of a young troubled man into the dark world of drug abuse and crime. Finn not only wrote the script but also directed and edited the film. All actors are fellow learners whose contribution was greatly appreciated.

In Finns own words; "When I made this short film, I had so much fun doing it that I thought to myself that if I had to do a job for the rest of my life, it would be playing or directing movies. The crew was brilliant; the actors were really fun to film with, and

the excitement of being able to direct a movie was just unreal for me, it was just a dream coming true. This competition gave me the opportunity of a lifetime".



The feedback from the ICCL has been excellent, the competition panel remarked on the quality of the films execution in terms of style, editing and screenwriting. With our permission they are going to share the film with their award-winning filmmaker, so she can provide some professional feedback and advice on the film, which may be of use as Finn takes his craft to the next level. All the staff and learners at Youthreach Gortahork wish to congratulate Finn and all those involved with the making of this remarkable film.
